FIRST AID REFRESHER COURSES – Attendance Based and Online courses.



We have continued to monitor the availability of attendance based courses in recent months, taking into consideration the difficulties associated with running attendance based courses during the Covid -19 pandemic.

Following a review of providers meeting NARCH requirements, it would seem that attendance based first aid refresher courses are in short supply, with some course providers offering online courses only. As a result, the Committee has agreed that from 1st April 2022, all NARCH members needing to refresh their First Aid training will be encouraged to try to find an attendance based course (that meets NARCH requirements) wherever possible. However, should this not be possible, members may take an online course providing the course meets NARCH requirements and this will be irrespective of whether their previous refresher had been an attendance based course or an online course.

Please do visit the **first aid guidance document** held in the Resource Library of the NARCH website, which provides a list of attendance based and online first aid refresher course providers meeting NARCH requirements.

The NARCH Committee will revisit this matter on 1st October 2022 to determine whether our first aid refresher rules can revert to pre-Covid times.

ADVANCED TREADMILL TRAINING REQUIRMEENTS

A reminder to members that the OCN West Midlands Level 3 Diploma in Small Animal Hydrotherapy now covers our requirements for joining, including advanced treadmill training.

Please be aware that for those members who do not have the Diploma and need to complete additional water treadmill training, you will need to have completed all three of the following units to use a water treadmill without supervision from a RCH who does hold the necessary water treadmill qualifications:

Practical Advanced Aquatic Treadmill Techniques (R/617/5754) Gait Analysis and Biomechanics (J/617/5749) and Tissue Healing Processes (H/617/5760)

USE OF DISCLAIMERS



In order to comply with the NARCH Guide to Professional Conduct for Registered Canine Hydrotherapists, section 2 'Your responsibilities for the welfare and care of patients' all RCH's must:

 obtain signed permission from the referring veterinary surgeon confirming that it is safe and appropriate for the patient to be treated with hydrotherapy.

• never treat any animal, even if only for recreation/fitness, without a veterinary surgeon's signature.

• obtain clinical history and areas of caution or concern from all veterinary surgeons involved in the patient's care.

Therefore, it is not acceptable for any patient to commence any form of hydrotherapy with just a disclaimer from the owner. A NARCH referral form can be found in the resource library section of the website.
